I. Show Membership and Options

Individuals applying for show membership must be AAHJA Senior members. Corporate entities must have at least a single member of their principals as an AAHJA member.

Membership dues for a horse show affiliated with AAHJA are \$50 per show. Show Membership applications and dues should be mailed to: Tonia Dolph Epps, AAHJA Show Coordinator, 330 Lexington Circle, Athens, 30605.

To present the entire AAHJA program, a manager must either allocate two arenas in order to offer the whole program on a single day, or split the program to run a portion on each of two concurrent days in a single arena. A manager opting to present a show is not obligated to present every division offered, but has only agreed to present at least 5 hunter/ equitation AAHJA divisions or 3 jumper divisions. A frequent option which people choose if not running the entire program is a “Beginner” show offering divisions from the Pre-Beginner to the Green Hunter or the Long Stirrup; or holding a Jumper show. Divisions must be offered in the proper order (see Rule 4.C.3.).

The Board of Directors of AAHJA reserve the right to refuse membership to a show if by majority opinion it is deemed that refusal of recognition is in the best interests of the Association. (Rule 4.B.)

II. Applications and Deadlines

These deadlines are all very important. Failure to comply with these deadlines may result in penalties per Rule 7.B.

For a horse show to obtain AAHJA membership, the completed application form and appropriate fee must be received by the Show Coordinator at least **60 days** prior to the planned date of the show.

In order to reserve a show date for the following season, show managers must submit the application and fee by **December 1**. Senior shows maintain priority for pre-existing or open dates until the December Board meeting. Any one show manager may have no more than 3 sanctioned shows per calendar year approved at the December Board meeting. Additional shows may be presented for approval consideration to the Board on an individual basis after the December 1 deadline.

If a show date must be changed after the calendar is set, notification must be submitted in writing to the Board at least **30 days** before the original show date with a fee of \$5. This does not include provisions made for planned rain dates. Although consideration will be given to unforeseen circumstances, a canceled show forfeits all fees to the Association. Cancelled horse shows forfeit priority of existing dates for the following year/season. (Rule 4.A. sec. 3)

Prize lists must be submitted to the AAHJA Show Coordinator **allowing a 5 day turn around for approval before mail out.** Ideally, you should mail or e-mail out prize lists at least 2 weeks prior to your show. It is recommended that you get your prize lists to the AAHJA Show Coordinator at least 3 weeks before your show to allow for any changes. Prize lists will be reviewed for compliance with AAHJA rules and show managers notified of any changes required before distribution. Proof of insurance must also be submitted at this time. *If corrections are required, an amended copy of the corrected prize list must be placed on file with the AAHJA Show Coordinator prior to publication and mailing.* Prize Lists should be sent to: Tonia Dolph Epps, 330 Lexington Circle, Athens, GA. 30605, or e-mailed: ToniaD2@aol.com. *****NEW FEE*** Complete show result packets must be sent on the designated forms to the AAHJA Point Secretary postmarked within 7 days of the show or an incomplete/ late fee of \$25 will be charged.**

Complete show results packets must include the following:

1. Completed Show Point Forms for each AAHJA division (use AAHJA form)
2. Master list of Exhibitors Form, including back numbers & AAHJA membership numbers (use AAHJA form)
3. New Members Report Form, listing any new AAHJA members that join at your show (use AAHJA form)
4. Originals or copies of Judges cards for all AAHJA classes (Rule 5B Sec 5)

Incomplete packets cannot be processed and will be considered late until all necessary forms are submitted. Shows with excessively or repeatedly late/ incomplete packets will risk losing their sanctioning for future shows. III Important Rules and Recommendations

These rules need to be paid special attention to by show managers!

1. AAHJA rules limit a horse's competition per day to 7 over fences classes. It is the show management's and the show secretary's responsibility to enforce this limit. Riders may enter no more than two hunter divisions of consecutive height. (Rule 9.C. sec.3)
2. All ponies competing in the pony hunter division must possess a measurement card from AAHJA, GHJA, or USEF, or the pony must be measured by the show steward prior to competing. Entrants must provide show management with their measurement number, and this number must be entered on the entry form for points to count.
3. AAHJA requires that show management hire qualified medical personnel to be on hand for the duration of the show.
4. Show management is required to provide the judge with the abbreviated AAHJA Rule List & Appropriate Equitation Tests for medal classes, published by the Board of Directors. Show management must also provide at the secretary stand: a.) an AAHJA and an USEF Rule Book. b.) a USEF approved measurement stick. Management can borrow the AAHJA owned stick, but it is his or her responsibility to attain and return the stick to the President within three days. **FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH ANY PART OF THIS RULE WILL RESULT IN A \$50 FINE FOR EACH VIOLATION.** (Rule 5.B. sec. 13)
5. Penalties: The Board reserves the right to impose such penalties for rule violations as provided by Rule XI of the USEF. First offenses for rule violations may be subject to a fine not to exceed \$50. Second violation of the same rule will result in a fine not to exceed \$75. Third violation of the same rule will result in withdrawal of AAHJA show status. (Rule 7.B.)

6. Although AAHJA does not restrict management from applying additional fees, a complete description of all fees must be provided in the prize list. It is recommended that additional fees be explained at the secretary's stand at check in.
7. The entry form published in the prize list must be the entry form used on the day of the show.
8. If you hold a one ring horse show, it is recommended that you restrict the last 15 minutes of your schooling time for just the Pre- Beginner and Junior Beginner riders. This will give them time to school in the arena without other riders jumping fences around them.

IV Class Offerings & Options for Combining/ Splitting Divisions

A complete list of classes and division offerings is included in the Rule Book. AAHJA classes must be offered as the full divisions listed in the Rule Book, with Champion and Reserve Champion awarded for each division. Presenting a partial division does not comply with AAHJA guidelines, the classes will not count for show requirements, and the ribbons awarded will not accrue points toward year-end awards. Descriptions and specifications must be printed in the prize list, and show managers may use the abbreviated list verbatim that is supplied in this packet. (Rule 4.C. sec2.a.)

In the event of insufficient entries (manager's discretion), classes or divisions may be combined. In order for points to count toward year-end awards, a division must have been held and judged at a minimum of three different shows with a minimum of three ribbon winners in each class of the division. (Rule 11.A. sec.1). Managers are encouraged to combine, rather than cancel, related divisions since points are still earned when divisions are combined.

AAHJA allows the following divisions to be combined (Rule 9.B. sec.4):

- a. Junior Beginner I & Adult Beginner
- b. TRM Crossrail Equitation & Adult Crossrail Equitation
- c. Short Stirrup & Long Stirrup (Hunter or Equitation)
- d. Short/ Long Stirrup Equitation & Age Group Equitation - EACH DIVISION MUST JUMP AT ITS SPECIFIED HEIGHT
- e. Short/ Long Stirrup Medal, Pony Medal, Junior/ Adult Medal- EACH CLASS MUST JUMP AT ITS SPECIFIED HEIGHT
- f. Crossrail Medal & Green Rider Medal- EACH CLASS MUST JUMP AT ITS SPECIFIED HEIGHT
- g. Pre-Children's Hunter & Pre-Adult Hunter and/or Open Hunter and/or Pony Hunter
- h. Children's/ Adult Amateur & Working Hunter
- h. Green Hunter & Green Rider Hunter

The following divisions can be split:

- a. Junior Beginner I & Adult Beginner I- this division can be held in three sections if necessary (9 and under, 10-17, and Adult)
- b. Green Hunter & Green Rider Hunter- Can be split into 18" height section and 2' height section (Rule 9.A. sec. 6)
- c. Short & Long Stirrup Equitation & Hunter

V Sample Forms and Necessary Documents (<http://aahja.org/trainershow-toolbox.php>)

The following forms are found at the end of this packet. You will need to copy several of these to have enough copies for your show. Please make multiple copies if you have more than one show in a year. **PLEASE BE SURE TO USE THESE NEW FORMS EACH YEAR—THEY DO CHANGE!!!**

- A. AAHJA Membership Forms: to be included in your prize list. This form also needs to be available at the secretary stand for exhibitors. (Please be sure to use the form in this packet because this year we added an address change.)
- B. Show Point Form: To be completed by the show manager or show secretary. This form must be returned to the AAHJA Point Secretary (along with copies or originals of the judge's cards) postmarked within **7 days** of the completion of your horse show.
- C. Master List of Exhibitors Form: To be completed by the show manager or show secretary and returned to the AAHJA Point Secretary with the show results. Please make sure to include all AAHJA membership numbers.
- D. New Members Reporting Form: To be completed by the show manager or show secretary and returned to the AAHJA Point Secretary with the show results. Please record the names of any members that join at your show on this form for the Point Secretary. (All completed AAHJA membership applications and fees need to be sent to the AAHJA Membership Secretary.)
- E. Judge's Abbreviated Rule List & Appropriate Equitation Tests for Medal Classes: To be photocopied and supplied to the judge(s).
- F. Abbreviated Division Descriptions: To be used in your prize list verbatim if you wish to abbreviate the descriptions of the offered classes.
- G. Rule Violation Protest Form: To be used by your show steward in the case of a protest brought up by a member at a show. This form must be properly filled out and returned to the show steward with the \$25 filing fee.
- H. Stewards Report Form: To be used by your show steward to send in to the AAHJA Board Steward. Show management is required to provide this form to the show steward, and the show steward is required to send it to the AAHJA Board Steward within 10 days of the date of the show.
- I. Application for Circumstantial Eligibility: To be photocopied (5-10 times) and made available at the secretary stand in the event an exhibitor's eligibility for a division must be documented and evaluated.

VI. Obtaining the AAHJA Mailing List

Show managers should contact the Membership Secretary for the updated mailing labels before you mail out prize lists. Contact Kathy Jones at springbreakfarm@bellsouth.net or 678-549-7012. Show Managers are encouraged to send AAHJA prize lists to non-members who would be interested in the horse show. You have the option of e-mailing prizelists to save time, money, & trees. To this effect you can e-mail the approved prize list to Member Services Board Member (Frank Milward milwardathens@msn.com who will post it on the AAHJA web site (<http://aahja.org/index.php>), announce it on Facebook (<https://www.facebook.com/AthensAreaHunterJumperAssociation?ref=hl>) and e-mail to current and past members.

VII Prize List Requirements

Along with the prize list, all show managers are required to **provide proof of insurance for their show**, listing AAHJA as an additional insured on the policy. (Rule 4.A.sec 2.)

This information comes straight from Rule 4. C. All Prize lists must be submitted to the Show Coordinator allowing a five day turn around for approval before mail out. The prize list of every AAHJA affiliated horse show must contain the following:

- a). The AAHJA page (or half page):

This horse show is an affiliated member of the Athens Area Hunter Jumper Association, and is held in accordance with the rules and regulation of the AAHJA. Any individual participating in this horse show is subject to these rules, and therefore is responsible for a knowledge and understanding of the rules of the Association. This horse show holds the following divisions that are recognized by the AAHJA for annual awards:

(List the recognized divisions with complete class specifications from the rule book, or use abbreviated class descriptions verbatim as provided in this packet.)

- b). The amount of entry fees and prizes offered in each class.
- c). Names of officials and judges. TBA will not be accepted for any show judge, steward, or manager.
- d). Exact date and location of show with directions.
- e). Tentative time schedule and information concerning warm-up. The warm up period is decided upon and enforced by show management. Management may offer warm-up at no fee or may charge for warm-up tickets. Warm-up is limited to 6 horses at a time in the ring unless the show steward feels that the ring is large enough to accommodate more horses safely.
- f). Statement concerning post entries and full description of any additional fees charged, such as “office”, “schooling”, and “day” fees. .
- g). Entry blank with room for AAHJA membership number. The entry blank published in the prize list must be the entry blank used on the day of the show.
- h). AAHJA membership form
- i.) Each horse show is also required to provide a liability disclaimer to be signed by the exhibitor, parent, or trainer in their prize list which includes the AAHJA in all aspects of the disclaimer. Any classes or divisions that are not AAHJA recognized must be clearly identified in the prize list.
- j.) Any farm wishing to hold an AAHJA show must present the classes in the order in which they are listed in the AAHJA Rule Book in Rule 9, with the exception of the Schooling Hunter Division (which may be held at any point between Divisions 8-11), and the Open Hunter Division (which may be held at any point between Divisions 16-18).
- k.) Prize lists must contain general arena descriptions, i.e. Main hunter ring is held in a grassy field with dimensions of 100’ by 200’.
- l.) Show managers are encouraged to include a list of future AAHJA show dates in their prize list. This list is available upon request from Tonia Dolph Epps, Toniad2@aol.com or 404-277-1196.
- m.) Since AAHJA requires proper turn out, managers with clientele that are accustomed to “schooling shows” may want to include a statement regarding proper attire.
- n.) Please include a spot on the entry form for pony measurement number.
- o.) Please refer to the Medal classes as The BarG Crossrail Medal, etc. in your prize list and announcements.

VIII. Pre-Show reminders:

- a) Mail show application and fees to AAHJA Show Coordinator at least 60 days prior to show date.
- b) Prize list & proof of insurance must be submitted to AAHJA Show Coordinator allowing a 5 day turn around before mailing date. Ideally this is 3 weeks or more before show date
- c) A show manager can contact AAHJA for a list of approved judges if needed. USEF “R” or “r” judges are automatically approved. (Rule 5.B. sec. 1).
- d) Management must have an AAHJA steward available on the show grounds from the beginning of warm up to the end of the show. All eligible stewards must pass the AAHJA stewards test in advance of accepting a stewarding job. (Rule 6.A.) The show steward, as the representative of AAHJA, must not be employed by the show in any other office, or be affiliated with the host farm (Rule 5.B. sec. 2). AAHJA has a list of current stewards available. In the event that a current member would like to bring up a rule violation, the steward must give them the Rule Violation Protest Form to fill out and send in. A copy of this form is enclosed in this packet.
- e) Shows are required to have qualified medical personnel available at the show.

IX. Post-Show reminders/ Show Results Packet

- a) Show Results Packet must be sent to the AAHJA Point Secretary on the designated AAHJA forms postmarked within 7 days of the show. Incomplete/ late packets will be charged a \$25 fee.
This includes:
 - 1. Completed Show Point Form- Properly filled out
 - 2. Original or copies of Judge’s Cards
 - 3. Master List of all Exhibitors Form with all AAHJA numbers
 - 4. New Members Reporting Form listing all who joined at your show
- b) Send completed AAHJA Membership applications & fees to the AAHJA Membership Secretary

The information in this packet is not designed to replace your Rule Book (please read your rule book <http://aahja.org/membership.php>), but merely provide a detailed reference to allow show managers to comply with AAHJA rules & procedures. ***A Professional is any individual who teaches or trains riding students, and/or trains or rides horses for remuneration. An Amateur is any adult rider who is not a professional.

JUDGE'S ABBREVIATED RULE LIST

The following guide is to help you understand the rules of the AAHJA. Please talk to the Show Manager or Show Steward if you have any questions regarding these rules.

1. AAHJA is an affiliate member of the USEF. Therefore, we follow the guidelines of the USEF, and our general rules are the same, i.e. no martingales in hack classes, boots or wraps allowed only in Equitation and Jumpers. ASTM approved helmets are required for **all riders**.
2. Proper attire is required of all riders, except beginner (Division I) riders are not required to wear a jacket. Jackets may be waived for all riders in extreme heat.
3. In the Crossrail Equitation and Crossrail Hunter Divisions, entries should not be penalized for trotting or trot-cantering courses, as long as they are consistent. Green Hunter, Green Equitation and Green Rider Hunter Division entries should not be penalized for proper simple lead changes.
4. AAHJA Tests for Pre-Beginner and Junior/Adult Beginner I Classics: These tests can be used for these divisions as needed by the judge or at shows holding special classics for these divisions.

Pre-Beginner:

1. Halt
2. At halt or walk demonstrate 2 point position.
3. Sitting trot.
4. At halt, while horse is held by a ring steward, rider drops and retrieves stirrups.
5. Answer very basic question—something a 5-7 year old would understand.

Jr/Adult Beginner I:

1. USEF Test #1, Halt and/or back up.
2. At halt, rider drops and retrieves stirrups.
3. At halt or walk demonstrate 2 point position.
4. Sitting trot.
5. USEF Test #3, figure eight at the trot.
6. USEF Test #6, pull up and halt from walk, trot or canter.
7. USEF Test #8, answer question(s) regarding horsemanship, tack, equipment, and/or conformation.

AAHJA Medal Classes- Appropriate Equitation Tests

Format: Medal courses to be judged over a course of 8-10 fences at division fence heights. At least 50% of the class, (a minimum of 4), is to be called back for work on the flat. O/f = 75%: flat = 25%.

Crossrail Medal Tests: 1-8, except #2

Short/Long Stirrup Tests: 1-8

Pony Medal Tests: 1-11

Jr/Adult Medal Tests: 1-19, except test 16, changing mounts

USEF Tests

Available to all Medal classes:

All Medal Class riders can be given additional tests over fences.

1. Halt and/or back.
2. Hand gallop. (**not allowed in Crossrail Medal)
3. Figure 8 at trot, demonstrating a change of diagonals.
4. Figure 8 at canter on correct lead, demonstrate Simple change of lead.
5. Work collectively (in collection) at w/ t, or canter.
6. Pull up and halt.
7. Jump obstacles on a figure 8 course.
8. Answer question(s) regarding basic horsemanship, tack, equipment, and/or conformation.

Available to Pony and Jr/Adult Medal classes:

9. Ride without stirrups, or drop and pick up stirrups.
10. Jump low obstacles at a walk and trot as well as at a canter.
11. Dismount and mount. Individually.

Available to Jr/Adult Medal class ONLY:

12. Turn on the forehand.
13. Figure 8 at canter on correct lead demonstrate a flying change of lead.
14. Serpentine at a trot and/or canter on correct lead demonstrate simple or flying changes
15. Change leads on a line using simple or flying changes.
16. NOT ALLOWED—changing mounts.
17. Canter on counter lead.
18. Turn on the haunches from the walk.
19. Demonstration ride of approximately 1 minute. Rider must advise judge of demonstration plan

AAHJA DIVISION DESCRIPTIONS

This horse show is an affiliated member of the Athens Area Hunter Jumper Association, and is held in accordance with the rules and regulations of the AAHJA. Any individual participating in this horse show is subject to these rules, and is therefore responsible for a knowledge and understanding of the rules of the Association. This horse show holds the following divisions that are recognized by AAHJA for annual awards:

PRE BEGINNER: For riders in their first year. Cross entry only into walk/trot classes in Jr/Ad Beginner.

JUNIOR/ADULT BEGINNER: For riders in their first or second year of showing who have not shown above the beginner level. Suitability of mount to rider to be stressed. Rider may cross enter the TRM Crossrail division and the Crossrail Medal. Division may be divided: riders aged 9 and under, riders aged 10 to 17, and riders 18 and over.

TRACY RAGAN MCKENNA/ ADULT CROSSRAIL EQUITATION: Riders must be in their first or second year of showing, and may never have shown over jumps larger than 18". Rider not to be penalized for trotting courses. Flat class will be split to canter if entries warrant (into groups of 6-8). Riders may cross enter into Beginner I or Crossrail Hunter division, but not both. Riders are eligible for the Crossrail Medal class.

CROSSRAIL HUNTER: Riders in first or second year of showing, and never have shown over jumps larger than 18". No penalty for trotting course or trotting lead changes. Rider may enter the Crossrail Equitation and the Crossrail Medal **OR** the Crossrail Medal, the Green Equitation, the Green Rider Medal, and the 18" portion of the Green Rider Hunter division.

GREEN HUNTER: Same as Green equitation, but for green horses. Horses jumping 18" may cross enter 18" divisions only if rider is eligible; 2' horses may cross enter any non-beginner division not exceeding 2' in height.

GREEN EQUITATION: Open to riders in their first or second year of showing over fences greater than 18" crossrails. Courses of simple 18" verticals with no width (i.e. gates, flower boxes, but no in and outs). No penalties for simple lead changes. Riders may cross enter Crossrail Hunter, Green Rider Hunter, and Green Hunter (if horse is green).

GREEN RIDER HUNTER: Open to green riders in first or second year of showing over fences greater than 18" crossrails. Courses will be simple verticals (no wider than a rail). Rider must declare one fence height. 18" riders may cross enter Crossrail Hunter, Green Eq, and Green Hunter (if horse is green). 2' riders may cross enter Green Eq and 2' Green Hunter (if horse is green).

SCHOOLING HUNTER: Open to all horses and ponies. Horses to be judged over a course fences not to exceed 2' in height or width. No in and outs, but oxers may be used. Change in direction is required.

SHORT/ LONG STIRRUP HUNTER: Open to riders in their first or second year of showing over 2' fences and eligible for this division for two years. Penalty for trotting courses. Fences not to exceed 2' in height or width, no in and outs. Division may be divided into short (rider under 12) and long (riders 13 and over). Cross-entry into 2' schooling divisions and age eq. up to 2'6" for short stirrup. Long stir. May enter any 2'6" or under class.

SHORT/LONG STIRRUP EQUITATION: Same eligibility requirements as Short/Long Stirrup Hunter.

JUNIOR EQUITATION: Junior riders on horses or ponies which may be split as follows: riders 11 and under to be judged over 2' and riders 12-17 to be judged over 2'6". In and outs and oxers allowed.

PONY HUNTER: Open to ponies shown by amateurs. Ponies may opt to jump either fence height at the rider's discretion. In and outs acceptable, oxers not to exceed 2' in width.

ADULT EQUITATION: Open to adult amateur riders with fences not to exceed 2'6". In and outs and oxers allowed. May be combined with the juniors.

AAHJA MEDAL CLASSES: Medal class to be judged over a course of 8-10 fences. At least 50% of the riders (minimum of 4) will be called back for additional work on the flat which will count 25%. Riders may be tested using AHSA tests 1-19, excluding #16. Crossrail, Green Rider, and Short/Long riders test 1-8 (excluding 2 and 5 for Crossrail). Four riders must complete the fences portion for the class to run. For full rules, see AAHJA Rule Book rule 10B.

PRE-CHILDREN'S/ PRE-ADULT HUNTER: Junior and amateurs on horses and ponies over fences not to exceed 2'6" in height and 2' in width. May split between Children and Adults, or combine with Open Hunter.

OPEN HUNTER: All riders on horses or ponies over fences not to exceed 2'6" in height and 2' in width. May be combined with Children/Adult hunter.

CHILDREN'S/ ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER: Juniors and amateurs on horses or ponies over fences not to exceed 3' in height and 2'6" in width. May be combined with Working Hunter.

WORKING HUNTER: All riders on horses or ponies over fences not to exceed 3' in height and 2'6" in width. May be combined with Junior/Amateur Hunter.

INTRO JUMPERS: Open to all riders to compete over fences 2'6"-2'9". Division consists of 2 classes, USEF table for each class to be determined by show management.

LOW SCHOOLING JUMPER: Same as Intro Jumper with fences 3'.

HIGH SCHOOLING JUMPER- Same as Intro Jumper with fences at 3'6".
